n 1880 E. W. Benson, then Anglican Bishop of Truro, England, composed a Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols, based on hymns, carols, and scriptural passages from the Bible. The service was adapted by King's College, Cambridge, and has been used on Christmas Eve ever since.

Many adaptations of the service have been formed over the decades. The service used this morning has been edited for United Methodist congregations and is found in the United Methodist Book of Worship. The strength of the service derives from the scripture lessons. Dean Milner-White of Kings College pointed out: "the main theme is the development of the loving purposes of God seen through the windows and the words of the Bible."

This morning, we join together in this holy place and go in heart and mind into the story of God's incarnation and salvation. Furthermore, let us find ourselves in the story, wrapped in God's love.

The wise men follow a star to find the child Jesus, the King of the Jews.
